Since 1984, Flower City Habitat has brought partners together to build homeownership, communities, and hope in Rochester.

- Habitat has partnered with 243 families as they earned, purchased, and moved into decent, affordable homes
- Habitat builds in clusters to strengthen communities, Habitat has built 83 homes and counting within a half mile of School 17, the anchor of the JOSANA neighborhood
- Appraised values in the JOSANA neighborhood have gone up 16.9% since Habitat first started building homes there
- Over 3,000 residents have been impacted through Habitat's home builds and neighborhood revitalization projects such as JOSANA's gateway garden.
- According to a study done on Rochester Habitat families, 98% of children raised in a Habitat home graduate high school and 72% of them pursue a post high school education.
- Habitat homeowners have contributed over \$9.3 million in tax revenue to the City of Rochester.
- Since launching the Homeward Bound Program, seven families who previously would have been turned down to be a part of the Homebuyer program have been guided down a path of financial well-being through financial literacy training and coaching.

THE SPONSOR

This is the seventh house built by the Perinton faith Community since 1999. We raise funds and recruit volunteers to build a Habitat house ever three years.
